Human kings cannot enable long-term happiness

Isaiah 24:1-26:6 (NIVUK)

24 See, the LORD is going to lay waste the earth and devastate it;

he will ruin its face and scatter its inhabitants –

² it will be the same

for priest as for people,

for the master as for his servant,

for the mistress as for her servant,

for seller as for buyer,

for borrower as for lender,

for debtor as for creditor.

³ The earth will be completely laid waste and totally plundered.

The LORD has spoken this word.

- ⁴ The earth dries up and withers, the world languishes and withers, the heavens languish with the earth.
- ⁵ The earth is defiled by its people; they have disobeyed the laws,

violated the statutes

and broken the everlasting covenant.

⁶ Therefore a curse consumes the earth; its people must bear their guilt.

Therefore earth's inhabitants are burned up, and very few are left.

- ⁷ The new wine dries up and the vine withers; all the merrymakers groan.
- ⁸ The joyful tambourines are stilled, the noise of the revellers has stopped, the joyful harp is silent.
- ⁹ No longer do they drink wine with a song; the beer is bitter to its drinkers.
- ¹⁰ The ruined city lies desolate; the entrance to every house is barred.
- ¹¹ In the streets they cry out for wine; all joy turns to gloom, all joyful sounds are banished from the earth.
- ¹² The city is left in ruins, its gate is battered to pieces.

The floodgates of the heavens are opened, the foundations of the earth shake.

¹⁹ The earth is broken up, the earth is split asunder, the earth is violently shaken.

²⁰ The earth reels like a drunkard, it sways like a hut in the wind;

so heavy upon it is the guilt of its rebellion that it falls – never to rise again.

²¹ In that day the LORD will punish the powers in the heavens above and the kings on the earth below.

²² They will be herded together

like prisoners bound in a dungeon; they will be shut up in prison and be punished^b after many days.

- no escape for others (24:16b-18b)

- complete destruction of the planet (24:18c-20)

- heavenly and earthly rulers all held to account (24:21-22)

25 LORD, you are my God;

- ² You have made the city a heap of rubble, the fortified town a ruin,
- the foreigners' stronghold a city no more; it will never be rebuilt.
- ³ Therefore strong peoples will honour you; cities of ruthless nations will revere you.
- ⁴ You have been a refuge for the poor, a refuge for the needy in their distress,
- a shelter from the storm and a shade from the heat.

For the breath of the ruthless is like a storm driving against a wall

5 and like the heat of the desert.

You silence the uproar of foreigners; as heat is reduced by the shadow of a cloud, so the song of the ruthless is stilled.

- ⁶On this mountain the LORD Almighty will prepare a feast of rich food for all peoples,
- a banquet of aged wine the best of meats and the finest of wines.
- ⁷ On this mountain he will destroy the shroud that enfolds all peoples, the sheet that covers all nations;

⁸ he will swallow up death for ever.

The Sovereign LORD will wipe away the tears from all faces;

he will remove his people's disgrace from all the earth.



² Open the gates that the righteous nation may enter, the nation that keeps faith.


³ You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in you.
