28 Woe to that wreath, the pride of Ephraim's drunkards, to the fading flower, his glorious beauty,

set on the head of a fertile valley –

to that city, the pride of those laid low by wine!

² See, the Lord has one who is powerful and strong.

Like a hailstorm and a destructive wind,

like a driving rain and a flooding downpour, he will throw it forcefully to the ground.

- ³ That wreath, the pride of Ephraim's drunkards, will be trampled underfoot.
- ⁴That fading flower, his glorious beauty, set on the head of a fertile valley,
- will be like figs ripe before harvest –
 as soon as people see them and take them in hand,
 they swallow them.
- ⁵ In that day the LORD Almighty will be a glorious crown,
- a beautiful wreath

for the remnant of his people.

- ⁶He will be a spirit of justice to the one who sits in judgment,

they reel from beer,

To children weaned from their milk, to those just taken from the breast?


